II. Tentative Course Timeline

Course Overview/Snapshot:

This course is designed to meet the needs of all students. Students engage in the writing process with special attention to the four different types of writing styles (expository, descriptive, persuasive, and narrative.) The spelling and grammar curriculum is taught in connection with student writing.

Students will read grade-appropriate and challenging classical and contemporary pieces, which include poetry, short stories, and nonfiction. Students should expect homework several times per week and will have several assignments submitted via Google classroom.
